

Spoken Language:

Children will engage in debate about the reasons that the war started and will discuss the key question throughout the half term.

Writing:

Children will write a flashback narrative using props as a stimulus to return to a specific part in the war and a newspaper report on the Blitz.

PE:

Children will learn the skills to play football and netball and to work as a team.

Science:

Children will learn about life-saving light and the role it played in WW2 in keeping people and soldiers safe.

DT:

The children will use their sewing skills to make a soft toy for a child in WW2 using the make do and mend mentality.

Music:

Children will learn body themes, percussion and variation in the context of WW2 songs.

Engage:

Children will go on a trip to Fort Nelson where they will be immersed in the start of WW2. They will try a range of activities to help with the war effort. We will also go on a trip to the D-Day Museum later in the half term.

Key question: In what ways did WW2 impact people globally?

World War 2



Prove it:

Children will respond to the key question by choosing an area of history to learn about in more detail and present to the class based on their existing knowledge.

Express:

Parents will be invited along to take part in a VE Day celebration on **Friday 18th October 2024 at 2pm.**

Maths:

Children will learn about place value, formal methods of calculation for multiplication and division. They will also solve problems using all four operations.

Computing:

Children will learn about web page creation and will design and evaluate their own webpage using google sites.

History:

Children will learn key dates and complete a timeline of WW2, including the reasons that led to the declaration of war. They will look at historical sources to learn about the past including the Blitz, the holocaust and the home front. They will learn about the role of the women and the impact locally and around the world.

PSHE:

The focus is 'being me in my world' which will look at goals for the future and impacts on your own and others' lives.

RE:

Children will explore the concept of salvation in the context of Christianity.
